## Re: Arrangements to continue education if schools close due to the spread of the Coronavirus - COVID-19

We would like to thank you for your support in encouraging your sons and daughters to work hard at school and to behave so sensibly and maturely despite the national concerns regarding spread of the coronavirus COVID-19. It is because of these exceptionally positive attitudes to school and to learning that Ofsted was so impressed with our two schools recently.

Thank you also for your support in encouraging your sons and daughters to continue washing hands regularly and thoroughly. Please continue with this, ensuring that they do so thoroughly with soap and running water before they come to school in the morning, when they get home in the afternoon and through the day when they go to the toilet or go to eat. We have shared information on good hand hygiene with your sons and daughters as well as placing posters around the building to remind them of the importance of this. At both schools there has been extra cleaning during the day of surfaces.

You have heard on the news that there is a possibility that schools will have to close for some time to delay the spread of the virus. We have not been told that this is going to happen but we will let you know straight away if we are told that it is to become necessary.

We are making plans now so that students will be able to continue with lessons at home through online learning, particularly with Google Classroom. The class teachers will also be in the virtual classrooms and they will put the students' work there. If we do have to close, we will give you more information about these arrangements.

We will also make sure that your son's/daughter's teachers' email addresses are on the school websites so that you can contact them if you need to ask them questions about the work.


